



Schoenoplectus mucronatus

Habit: An attractive sedge species commonly found fringing freshwater systems up to 300mm of water. It grows in erect clumps up to a height of 70cm.

Identifying Features:

- Plant height 40-70cm
- Stems are triangular and bright green in colour
- Seed heads grow from the middle of the stem near the tip of the plant.
- Seed heads are brown in a small cluster
- Flowers in summer to autumn

Notes:

Schoenoplectus mucronatus is often used in wetland plantings for constructed wetlands and ornamental ponds

This species is not especially drought tolerant with a tendency to brown off during drought.
